From the Pastor

HOLY PENANCE

After the penitent has told his sins, whether venial or mortal, the priest answers with words of consolation and encouragement. Mortal sins are those of a grave matter, committed with full knowledge and full consent of the will; they must be confessed with the number of times committed. Sometimes, the priest must challenge the person to consider the state of his soul. The penitent, for his part, may ask for some clarification or some advice, which the priest will do his best to give. (Sometimes there may be a difficult question that the priest cannot answer immediately, since he needs to consult a better authority. This will mean that the penitent will have to return later.) When the priest is satisfied that he has understood everything he has heard and the penitent is finished with any questions, the priest prepares to give the penance, which will be explained next week.

Saint of the Week

9 July

Saint Maria Amandina

Seven Franciscan Missionaries of Mary came to China in 1898 to minister to the poor and the sick. A drought had ravaged the region, leading to widespread famine, and there was a typhus epidemic. The sisters wholly gave themselves to nursing the victims. The youngest among them was Maria Amandina. Born in Belgium in 1872, she had entered the Franciscan missionaries in Antwerp and trained as a nurse in Marseilles. At the mission in Taiyuan, Maria served in the dispensary of the hospital. The Chinese called her “the sister who is always laughing.” Maria’s prayer was, “Jesus, how can I thank you for casting your glance upon me? I have nothing except my life, my heart, my soul, my work, my song. In joy or sorrow, Jesus, reign in me until death takes me!” As the sisters tended to the hundreds who came to their doors, the Boxers were organizing their brutal campaign against foreigners throughout China. On 2 July 1900, a gang of Boxers entered the Franciscan compound and dragged the Christians, including the seven sisters, to prison. There was not even the attempt at a trial. On 9 July, they were taken to the gate outside the government offices and beheaded. The seven Franciscan Missionaries of Mary are among the 120 martyrs of China canonized by Pope Saint John Paul II on 1 October 2000.

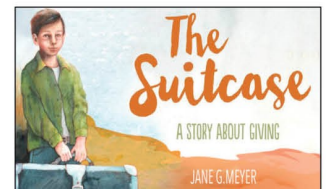
