## From the Pastor

### The Six Commandments

The Second Commandment of the Church is that we are to fast and abstain on the days appointed. Years ago, every Friday of the year was a day of abstaining from meat (the old “Fish on Fridays” tradition) and every day of Lent except for Sundays was a time of fasting. Also, the day before a major feast was a day of abstinence: Christmas Eve was such a day, which was the origin of the evening meal of seven different fish dishes for the Italians and others. Nowadays, fasting and abstinence are limited to Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. We are also to fast for an hour before receiving Holy Communion. We are asked to do so little in the way of fasting and abstinence; let us do it with a generous heart!

### Saint Benildus

Benildus was born Pierre in Thuret, France in 1805. The small, frail boy showed little promise for farm work, but was so quick at his studies that, at fourteen, he was called on to be a substitute teacher at the Christian Brothers’ school where he was still a student. The same year he joined the Brothers and for twenty years, taught in various schools. In 1841, Benildus was sent to Saugues, a small village in the south of France, where he was both principal and teacher. Under his lead, the school became the center of life in the village. His approach combined strict discipline, rigorous instruction, and deep respect for each student. No matter how humble a boy’s origins, he was always addressed as “Monsieur.” Benildus initiated many programs for “non-traditional” students; he created a night school for adults and tutoring programs for boys who were struggling. During his lifetime, over two hundred of his students joined the Christian Brothers, and many others became priests. When he died in 1862, at only fifty-seven, the students competed for the honor of carrying his coffin, and mourners plucked blades of grass from his grave as relics. In 1967, Pope Paul VI canonized this deeply good man who became holy amid the daily grind of a very simple life.
