From the Pastor

HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The full rite of anointing is used when the situation is not absolutely critical (the patient in cardiac arrest or in a serious accident). In critical situations, of course, the priest may leave out the preliminary prayers. Normally, the sacrament is administered in this way: After the sign of the cross, the priest greets the patient. "The peace of the Lord be with you always." The patient responds, "And with your spirit." The priest then gives a short instruction on the Sacrament about to be received, in the form of a prayer: "Lord God, you have said to us through your Apostle James, 'Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priest of the church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick person and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them.' Lord, we have gathered here in your name, and we ask you to be among us, to watch over this servant here before you. We ask this with confidence, for you live and reign for ever and ever." The prayer gives us the biblical basis for the sacrament (the Letter of James in the New Testament), tells us the ministers of the sacrament (the priests of the church), and what we do in order to administer it: prayer and anointing. The confidence we have in making this prayer is not just our own conviction. It is because Jesus is Lord, he lives and reigns forever and ever, and he himself makes this sacrament (and all sacraments) effective by the power of his cross.

Saint of the Week

20 October

Saint Maria Bertilla Boscardin

Anna Francesca Boscardin was born in a small town near Venice in 1888. Her parents were poor and her father drank. She had little education and, upon her entrance into the convent as a Sister of Saint Dorothy, having taken the name Maria Bertilla, she was sent to work in the children's ward of the hospital. Here she found her true calling, working with the most fragile and disturbed children. When the First World War broke out, Maria was assigned to nurse the wounded. When the bombings reached the doorstep of the hospital, she fearlessly remained with the injured soldiers until a safe retreat was possible. "Here I am, Lord, ready to do your will whatever may come, be it life, death, or terror," she wrote in her journal. Though her commitment won the admiration of the military officers, Maria's superior sent her to work in the hospital laundry - - until the Mother General intervened. With the return of peace, Maria was put in charge of the children's isolation ward, which gave her the greatest joy. In 1922, she had an operation for the removal of a tumor from which she never recovered. She died on this date in 1922. She is the patron saint of pediatric nurses.
