From the Pastor

HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Once the prayer of instruction has been offered, the rite of anointing says the following: "If the sick person so wishes, the sacrament of penance may now be celebrated." If the patient has not done so before, the priest asks whether he or she wishes to confess. The primary sacrament of forgiveness and reconciliation is Penance, though the church has always taught that Holy Anointing is a conferring of forgiveness and spiritual healing as well as its primary purpose, a strengthening of one's faith in time of sickness. Whether the patient chooses to confess or not, the sacrament properly so-called can now begin: it consists of the laying on of hands by the priest (or bishop), and the two-part anointing.

Saint of the Week 25 October **Saint John Houghton and the Carthusian Martyrs of London**

John Houghton was born to a family of lesser nobility in Essex, England, in 1487. Educated at Cambridge, he was ordained a parish priest in 1501, but later entered the London Charterhouse of the Carthusian Order, the strictest of all the contemplative Orders of the Church. He soon became Prior or Superior of the House at a dangerous time, the reign of Henry VIII. In 1535, John was arrested for refusing to sign the Act of Supremacy that named Henry and not the Pope "the supreme head of the Church in England." Arrested, interrogated, tortured, John refused to bend, confessing the Pope, the Bishop of Rome, as Supreme Head of the Church, and not the King. He was found guilty of treason and sentenced with two other Carthusian Priors to be hanged, drawn and quartered at Tyburn. The King specifically ordered that they be executed in their monastic habits. Hanged with a soft, thick rope so that he would not die quickly, John was cut down while still alive, disemboweled, and cut in quarters with a knife. He bore the agony of the butchery with what seemed more than human patience, calling out continually the name of Jesus, whom he had followed in life and now in death. In the end, all 17 of the remaining monks of his monastery followed him in martyrdom, some by execution, many more by exposure, sickness, and starvation.

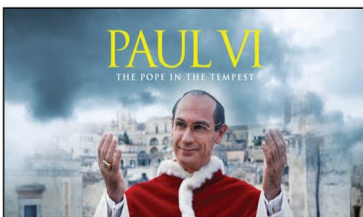

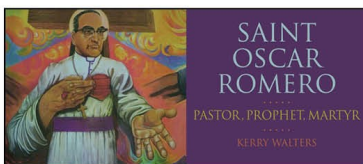
