The Six Commandments of the Church

The Fourth Commandment of the Church is that we receive Holy Communion during Eastertide. This commandment harkens back to the day when Holy Communion was rarely received. People had such a reverence and holy fear (perhaps too much) that they stayed away rather than receive the Eucharist unworthily. How times have changed! Whenever we receive Holy Communion, we must examine our lives to see whether we are in any grave sin. If that is the case, we must go to Confession.

Saint of the Week

26 August

Saint Jeanne Elizabeth Bichier des Anges

Elizabeth was born in 1773 at Le Blanc, France and went to a convent school in Poitiers. When she was nineteen, she learned enough of the law to go to court on behalf of her brother, whose belongings had been seized by the state. The brilliant young Elizabeth won the case. However, it was not the law that moved her, but the poor, who had multiplied in the wake of the civil strife of the French Revolution. When Elizabeth and her mother moved to their country estate, she divided her time between prayer and works of charity. Among her sufferings was seeing the split among the clergy between those who had taken the oath to accept the new revolutionary regime and those who had followed the Pope in refusing the oath. In the absence of a faithful priest, Elizabeth gathered people together to pray, sing, and read Scripture. She used to travel 25 miles for Mass celebrated in a barn by the trustworthy Father Andrew Fournet. Saint Andrew Fournet and Elizabeth shared a zeal for evangelization. Soon, he asked her to help him in his work of teaching the children of the poor. After a brief novitiate, Elizabeth began to lead the small group of Sisters Father Andrew had gathered. By 1830 the Daughters of the Cross had 60 convents in France serving children, the elderly and the destitute. Elizabeth died in 1838 after a long illness.

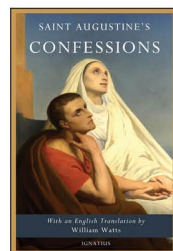
