From the Pastor

The Six Commandments of the Church

The Fifth Commandment is that we contribute to the support of the Church, her pastors, schools, and other institutions. The old wording very beautifully stated, "It is a duty to contribute to the support of religion according to our means, so that God may be duly honored and worshipped and the kingdom of His Church extended." We should contribute generously, but always "according to our means:" no one is meant by this law to be impoverished. However, as we all know, our nation has always had a separation of church and state, so that apart from our tax free status, there is no government financial support, as in most European countries, for example. Americans should keep this in mind and contribute accordingly. By the way, bishops, priests and deacons must also abide by this commandment and give generously!

Saint of the Week

10 September

Saint Nicholas of Tolentino

He was born in 1245 and named after the more familiar Saint Nicholas of Bari. From his youth, Nicholas was attracted to the life of the Augustinian friars, who lived near his home in Sant'Angelo, Italy. At 19 he joined the friars and was ordained 5 years later. After a few years traveling to different friaries, he was sent to Tolentino, where he spent the remaining years of his life. There, in a city wracked by dissension and strife between political parties, Nicholas preached every day, and gave himself with utmost devotion to rich and poor alike — although the miracles of healing he worked were mainly for the relief of the poor. He went to great lengths to reconcile sinners to God. He is said to have appeared to Nicholas to beg for prayers as he suffered in Purgatory. For this reason, he is held to be a patron of the poor souls. On his deathbed, he roused himself to go and hear the confession of a man in mortal sin, since he knew the man would confess to no one but him. He died after a long illness in 1305.

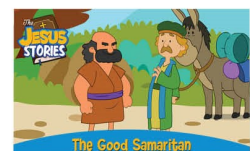
