Greed, part 1

It is also called avarice, cupidity, or acquisitiveness. In the Summa Theologiae, Medievel theologian St. Thomas Aquinas said greed "is a sin directly against one's neighbor, since one man cannot over-abound in earthly riches, without another man lacking them. It is also a sin against God, like all mortal sins, inasmuch as man despises things eternal for the sake of temporal things." Greed is giving one's heart and soul to a disordered desire for the things of this world, especially money, and turning away from the things of God.

Saínt Ita

Ita was an Irish saint, born Deirdre, in present day County Waterford, about the year 500. She took the name "Ita" because in Gaelic it means "thirst" and Ita had a parching thirst for God all her life. As a girl, she refused a betrothal, doing battle against her father's plans with a three-day fast. Her father gave in and Ita consecrated herself to God. She went off to a mountainous area. where she and other young women founded the convent of Killeedy. They took in young boys to be educated and Ita came to be known as the "foster mother" of the saints of Ireland. Saint Brendan himself learned his catechism at Ita's knee. She once said there were three things that most pleased God and three that most displeased him. God is pleased with true faith in a pure heart, a simple life with a grateful spirit, and a generous charity; he is most displeased with a hateful mouth, a resentful heart, and pride in wealth. Ita's wisdom and her healing powers drew many followers and her convent became a double monastery. She died around 570 after patiently suffering from a long illness, probably cancer.
