From the Pastor

Holy Penance:

The **third commandment** is about keeping a day for the service of the Lord: "Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day." The first and by far the most important way to keep Sunday holy is to go to Holy Mass and participate fully and attentively, body and soul. (This includes the Saturday evening vigil Mass, of course.) When we do this, the rest of the day is transformed. People may be uncomfortable with what some consider to be an outdated teaching, that missing Holy Mass is a mortal sin, but it is unchanged: we have a grave obligation to assist at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Have I missed Mass without good reason, sickness being the principle one? Have I made others miss Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation? Have I left early or been late for Mass for no good reason? There may be the rare occasion when we have to leave Mass early (though there are few situations why 5 minutes make a difference), but to do so habitually, as some do, is an offense against God and the others at Mass who stay to the end. Have I been willfully distracted during Mass? Have I done or commanded unnecessary servile work on Sunday or Holy Days of Obligation? Have I brought or sold things not of necessity on Sunday? This last one is difficult, no doubt. Now that stores are open every Sunday, we may forget. Of course, if we must buy something of necessity, there is no fault involved. But to plan supermarket shopping every Sunday is certainly forgetting that the Lord's Day is to be kept holy. Sunday should be a day when we set aside time to worship our God and then relax and enjoy our family and friends.

Saint of the Week

25 May *Saint Madeleine Sophie Barat*

Born in 1779 in Burgundy, France, Madeleine was a cooper's daughter. Her brother, Louis, eleven years older and a priest, educated her at home in Latin, Greek, the natural sciences, mathematics, Sacred Scripture and theology. She was a brilliant girl who readily accepted his strict regimen. With Louis, Madeleine went to Paris in the wake of the Reign of Terror. There she met Father d'Ainville, who became her spiritual director and helped her form a religious community to give girls the same thorough education that boys were receiving from the Jesuits. When twenty-three year old Madeleine, the youngest of the group, was named superior, she at once knelt and kissed the feet of her sisters. Madeleine spent her remaining sixty-three years leading the Society of the Sacred Heart. With humility, practicality and great tact, she oversaw the congregation's spread to four continents, including Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne's foundation of the first free school west of the Mississippi. Through rapid growth and repeated crisis, Madeleine never lost her spirit of prayer. "Go to the Heart of Jesus and draw from it," she told her sisters, "and when you need more, go back to the Spring and draw again." She also said, "For the sake of one child, I would have found the Society."
