From the Pastor

Holy Penance:

With the **fourth commandment**, we turn to our duties towards our neighbor: "Honor your father and your mother." This is the commandment with a promise attached to it: "That it may go well with you, and that you may have a long life in the land." It is an obligation we never shake, no matter our age: when they are young and we are their children, when they are old and in need, we must always honor and care for them, for they have given us earthly life and, it is to be hoped, a love for God and the Catholic Faith. This commandment also obliges us to respect and obey all legitimate authority, unless what is commanded is contrary to the Law of God. Have I been disobedient or disrespectful to my parents, or have I neglected or refused to aid them in their need or to do their last will? Have I shown irreverence to others in positions of authority? Have I spoken badly of or insulted priests or others consecrated to God? Have I failed in due reverence to the elderly? Have I mistreated my spouse or my children? Have I been disrespectful to my spouse? For children: have I disobeyed or disrespected my teachers or anyone else who has legitimate authority over me in the absence of my parents? Obedience to and respect for others is given not only to them, but through them, to God himself, since he is the source of all legitimate authority.

Saint of the Week

30 May Saint Joan of Arc

She was born to a peasant family at Domremy in northeastern France in 1412. At the age of fourteen she began to hear heavenly voices. Over three years, the Archangel Michael, Saint Margaret of Antioch, and Saint Catherine of Alexandria came to her. With increasing forcefulness, they urged her to lead the French crown prince, the dauphin, then locked in a struggle with the Duke of Burgundy and his English allies, to be crowned king. "I am a poor girl," she would reply. I do not know how to ride or fight." "It is God who commands," the voices replied. At last, Joan went to Charles VII and convinced him of her mission. The seventeen-year-old girl led the army clad in armor, carrying an ancient sword and a standard that read "Jesu, Maria." In short order, Joan took Orleans and then Reims, where Charles was crowned King, But in the next campaign, the English captured her, and the French made no effort to rescue her. The English tried Joan as a witch. During the trial, theologians tried to confuse the unlettered girl who had beaten them on the battlefield. Joan did stumble at times, confused by unknown terms like "church militant." She signed a retraction, but then returned immediately to her story. At last, she was found guilty and was burned at the stake in 1431, at the age of nineteen. She died clutching a tiny cross and calling Jesus and Mary. Twenty-four years later, her case was reopened and she was found innocent. She was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1920.
