**SAINT OF THE WEEK**

**9 January ~ Saint Henry of Uppsala, Bishop and Martyr.**

The date of his birth is uncertain. At the time of his consecration as bishop, Sweden was suffering terribly from the raids of Finnish pirates. King Saint Eric IX asked Henry to lead a crusade to convert the Finns, who were all still pagans. When they arrived in Finland, King Eric offered the terms: baptism and peace, or war. The Finns refused the terms and were defeated decisively at Turku. Dismayed at the fate of the Finns at the hands of the victorious Swedes, Henry asked to stay there and begin the peaceful conversion of the Finns. King Eric agreed, and Henry built a church at Nousis, where he began to preach and teach. A disaffected Finn named Lalli lay in wait for Henry and killed him with an axe at Kirkkosaari in 1160. Veneration of the saint in Scandinavia and England began immediately. He is patron saint of Finland and is invoked against storms at sea, especially by fishermen. Saint Henry, pray for us!

## Did You Know?



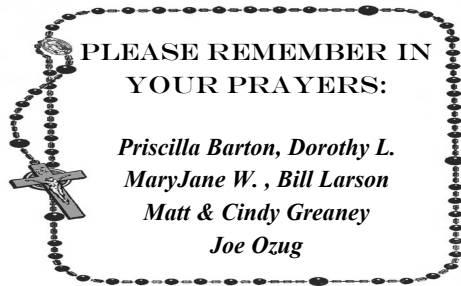
