HOLY PENANCE

What should we call this sacrament? Like Extreme Unction (before Vatican II), which came to be called the Sacrament of the Sick, Penance is known by a number of names. As the Catechism (#1423) tells us, "it is called the sacrament of Conversion because it makes sacramentally present Jesus' call to Conversion, the first step in returning to the Father, from whom one has strayed through sin. It is called the sacrament of Penance, since it consecrates the Christian sinner's personal and ecclesial steps of conversion, penance and satisfaction. It is called the sacrament of Confession, since the confession of sins to a priest is an essential element of this sacrament. In a profound sense, it is also the confession or praise of the holiness of God and of his mercy towards sinful man. It is called the sacrament of Forgiveness, since by the priest's sacramental absolution, God grants the penitent pardon and peace. It is called the sacrament of Reconciliation, because it imparts to the sinner the love of God who reconciles: "Be reconciled to God!" (2 Corinthians 5:20). He who lives by God's merciful love is ready to respond to the Lord's call: "Go; first be reconciled to your brother."

SAINT OF THE WEEK

1 February ~ Saint Brigid of Kildare. She was born in 451 or 452 near Dundalk, County Louth. Her mother was said to be a slave in the court of her father, Dubhthach, the pagan chieftain of Leinster. Refusing many good offers of marriage, she became a nun and took the veil from St. Macaille. With seven other nuns she founded the convent of Kildare, which soon became an important center for worship and education. So great was her spiritual influence that it was she who chose the Bishop of the region, the first being the monk, Saint Conleth. Thus, for centuries, Kildare was ruled by a double line of abbot-bishops and of abbesses, the Abbess of Kildare also being regarded as superior general of all the convents in Ireland. She founded a school of art, including metal work and illumination, over which St. Conleth presided. Even allowing for the exaggerated stories told of St. Brigid by her numerous biographers, she ranks as one of the most remarkable Irishwomen of the fifth or any century. St. Brigid died on this day in 525, at Kildare, leaving a cathedral city and school that became famous all over Europe. It was from such places that the light of learning and holiness returned to the Dark Ages of the European continent and saved western civilization. Saint Brigid (or Saint Bride) is the Patroness of Ireland, called "Mary of the Gael." Saint Brigid, pray for us!


INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY
