HOLY PENANCE

Now that we have finished our examination of conscience, we are ready to begin the Sacrament. We go in and kneel or sit. Every penitent has the choice of confessing anonymously or face to face. If there is a traditional box-style confessional and you wish to confess face-to-face, just ask and the priest will find a place of privacy nearby. If there is a full sized reconciliation room, there should be some kind of arrangement such that you can still confess anonymously. However you choose, the priest will help you. I usually begin with the Sign of the Cross, adding an ancient prayer for the penitent: "May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips so that you may humbly and truthfully confess all your sins." The penitent then begins, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been _____ weeks/months/years since my last Confession. These are my sins." Notice that we say, "Bless me, Father" and not "Forgive me, Father" because it is not the priest who forgives our sins, but God alone, through the words of the priest. As for the time past since our last Confession, there is no need to be absolutely exact. A general idea is enough. Next, we report our sins as best we can, concealing nothing. Remember, the priest has heard everything; he will not be shocked, so tell him everything. Moreover, priests are poor sinners, too, who have to confess their own sins to another priest. Though they must judge hearts and deeds in their role as confessor, they share the same human weaknesses we all do. If a priest ever acts or speaks with arrogance in the confessional, he will answer to God for it.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

7 April ~ Saint Herman Joseph. Herman was born in 1150 in the great city of Cologne, Germany. As a child, he had a great devotion to Mary and talked to her as one would to a friend. Praying once before a statue of Our Lady and the Christ Child, he reached up and offered her his apple. The story goes that the statue came to life and Mary bent down so that the Child Jesus could accept the gift! When he was old enough, Herman applied to and entered the Norbertine Abbey at Steinfeld. He served humbly in the refectory, until he was made the sacristan, a position he loved. After ordination to the priesthood, he began to receive visions and ecstasies as he said Mass. He was so devout and his Masses took so long that no one wanted to serve with him. Yet they loved him for his chaste innocence and called him Joseph, a name which stuck. He was a skilled clockmaker and frequently repaired the clocks in nearby convents; the nuns would claim that their clocks were broken so that the holy priest would come and pay them a visit. He lived a long and happy life as a canon and a priest. He was 91 years old when he was stricken at the Easter liturgies and died. He was immediately acclaimed a saint by those who had known him, but he was not formally canonized until Pius XII did so in 1958. He is the patron of watch and clockmakers. Saint Herman Joseph, pray for us!
