HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

We have, in the past two years or so, examined the Holy Eucharist and the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation in this column. These are, without a doubt, the two sacraments we receive most frequently as practicing Catholics. Holy Anointing is, after those two, the Sacrament a priest most often administers, especially if he is a hospital chaplain. It is also one that many people know relatively little about, mainly because when it is received, it is a time of crisis and suffering, and it is not easy to focus on the rite. Learning about it now will mean we can enter more fully into it, should the occasion arise when we need it. May God keep us healthy and strong, but by his grace and help, we have his promise of his unfailing presence whenever we fall seriously sick: the Sacrament of Holy Anointing.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

16 May ~ Saint Andrew Bobola. He was born to a noble Polish family in Sandomir in 1591. At the age of 20, he entered the Jesuits; after his ordination, he distinguished himself by his preaching and his tender care for plague victims. At this time, Poland was suffering waves of attacks by Russians and Cossacks, who supported the Orthodox against their Catholic neighbors. Andrew was sent to minister to the threatened Catholics in Lithuania. He built up the courage of the persecuted and engaged the Orthodox in debate, often winning them to the Catholic faith. He was called the "Hunter of Souls." At last, the bloody wars drove the Jesuits to Pinsk, where they found refuge on the estate of a Catholic prince. Andrew left the grounds daily to visit the faithful nearby. In 1657, the Cossacks abducted him after he had gone out to celebrate Holy Mass. He was beaten, dragged, gouged, flayed, and burnt. A sabre thrust to the heart ended his life. His body was buried in Pinsk, and in 1730 his grave was opened and his body was found to be incorrupt. He was canonized in 1957 by Pope Pius XII. He is patron of Poland and especially of the Archdiocese of Warsaw. Saint Andrew Bobola, pray for us!
