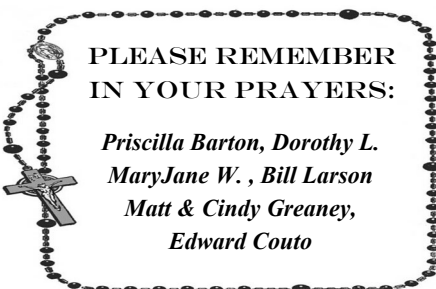

HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The full rite of anointing is used when the situation is not absolutely critical (the patient in cardiac arrest or in a serious accident). In critical situations, of course, the priest may leave out the preliminary prayers. Normally, the sacrament is administered in this way: After the sign of the cross, the priest greets the patient, "The peace of the Lord be with you always." The patient responds, "And with your spirit." The priest then gives a short instruction on the Sacrament about to be received, in the form of a prayer: "Lord God, you have said to us through your Apostle James, 'Are there people sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them.' Lord, we have gathered here in your name, and we ask you to be among us, to watch over this servant here before you. We ask this with confidence, for you live and reign for ever and ever." The prayer gives us the biblical basis for the sacrament (the Letter of James in the New Testament), tells us the ministers of the sacrament (the priests of the church), and what we do in order to administer it: prayer and anointing. The confidence we have in making this prayer is not just our own conviction. It is because Jesus is Lord, he lives and reigns forever and ever, and he himself makes this sacrament (and all sacraments) effective by the power of his Cross.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

12 June ~ Saint Eskil, Bishop & Martyr. The Swedes were a very difficult people to convert to Christianity. Saint Ansgar, the great Apostle of the North, brought Christ to them in the ninth century, but succeeding generations reverted to the old pagan religion. In the eleventh century, two brother saints, Sigfrid and Eskil, came from England to rekindle the Swedish mission. Eskil preached the gospel in Sodermanland, southwest of Stockholm, and eventually was consecrated bishop of Strangnas. King Inges supported Eskil in his evangelization, but when he died, King Sweyn "the Bloody" turned from Christianity back to the heathen religion of Odin and Thor. On one occasion, Sweyn presided at a feast in honor of the Norse gods. When Bishop Eskil arrived, he denounced the worship of the false gods in strong words and called upon the one true God to give a sign of his authority. Suddenly, a great hailstorm blew in and destroyed the pagan altar. The king flew into a rage and demanded the blood of Eskil. The pagans rushed upon him, killing him with a shower of stones. His relics were brought to the city of Tuna, which from then on came to be called Eskilstuna. In art, he is shown wearing a bishop's miter and holding three stones, the instrument of his martyrdom. He is one of the principal patrons of the Kingdom of Sweden. Saint Eskil, pray for us!

MARCH FOR LIFE

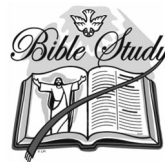
