

HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Once the prayer of instruction has been offered, the rite of anointing says the following: "If the sick person so wishes, the sacrament of penance may now be celebrated." If the patient has not done so before, the priest asks whether he or she wishes to confess. The primary sacrament of forgiveness and reconciliation is Penance, though the church has always taught that Holy Anointing is a conferring of forgiveness and spiritual healing as well as its primary purpose, a strengthening of one's faith in time of sickness. Whether the patient chooses to confess or not, the sacrament properly so-called can now begin: it consists of the laying on of hands by the priest (or bishop), and the two-part anointing.

SAINT OF THE WEEK


17 June ~ Saint Emily de Vialar. She was born in 1797 in Gail-larc, France. From an early age, she felt moved to help the poor, a desire which her mother supported, but her father strongly opposed. She persevered and prayed in secret, never leaving home. When she was 35, she received an inheritance that enabled her to buy a home for herself and three companions who had joined her in the work of feeding and teaching the poor. In 1835, the women made vows in a new congregation, the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Apparition. Emily and some of the sisters soon went to Algiers in North Africa to staff a hospital during a cholera epidemic. The local bishop was unhappy with the governance of the little community and had the sisters sent back to France. On her return, Emily found that a trusted associate had embezzled her remaining fortune. The sisters were so poor that at one point they had to go to a soup kitchen for food. Emily became the subject of malicious gossip, but she always took comfort in the words she had received in prayer, "Remain in my presence and do not stray from it." After five years of hardship, the saintly Bishop of Marseilles, Eugene de Mazenod, recognized the holiness of Emily and invited the community to make its home in his city. When she died in 1856, Emily had sent her sisters to serve in Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Australia. Saint Emily, pray for us!

Studies also show newborns can distinguish prose passages they heard during the last six weeks of pregnancy from new passages. Babies do learn and form memories while still in the womb!
