**HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

All the sacraments have their basis in the Bible, in something that Jesus said or did. The Sacrament of Anointing is no exception. When Jesus healed the sick, he used many visible signs to do so. One of these was the laying on of hands, as we read in Mark 8:25, when he gave sight to the blind man: "Jesus laid his hands upon his eyes; he looked intently and was restored and saw everything clearly." This is a powerful sign of God's action (it is also part of the Sacrament of Holy Orders). It is always done in silence, on the crown of the head if possible; no audible prayers are offered, though the priest is certainly praying silently, uniting himself with "the prayer of the Church." The sign is clear: though the priest is silent, the whole church is praying in him. His very silence makes us realize that the power of God, which needs no words to be effective, is quietly but mightily at work. It is also beautiful to consider that human touch, which is such an important sign of consolation and love, is part of this sacrament. The Church uses every possible means at her disposal to console and strengthen us in our sickness, even so common a one as one human being touching another. The sacraments use every means, visible and audible and tangible, to confer grace. The Anointing of the Sick is no exception.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK**

**22 June ~ Saint Paulinus of Nola:** He was born around the year 354 near what is now Bordeaux, France, to a noble family. He received the finest literary education at the feet of the pagan poet Ausonius. He rose quickly through the ranks and was soon sent to be governor of Campania, in the south of Italy. But public service left him feeling hollow, so he retired and began to travel. In Spain he met his wife, Theresia. After long years of waiting and praying, they had a little boy, but he died after only 8 days. This was a decisive moment for Paulinus and Theresia. They gave away much of their wealth to the poor, moved to Nola in Italy and began a life of prayer in separate cells near the tomb of Saint Felix. Before long, other friends came to join them. Paulinus kept in touch with many friends through his letters, writing to Saints Jerome, Augustine, and Martin of Tours. Eventually, he was elected Bishop of Nola, and spent 20 years serving them, with special care for the poor. He was also a great hymn writer and poet. His old teacher, Ausonius, still a pagan, berated him for his conversion and way of life, but Paulinus insisted that his poetry had found a new center. He wrote, "To my mind, the only art is faith, and Christ is my poetry." Saint Paulinus of Nola, pray for us!
