From Father Johnson

HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

With oil blessed by the bishop, the priest now anoints the sick person. First, he does so on the forehead, saying, "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." Then he anoints the hands, saying, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." The two prayers that accompany the anointing tell us in a few words what this sacrament effects in the sick: Love, mercy, the grace of the Holy Spirit, freedom from sin, and rising up from the bed of sickness. Depending upon the culture and traditions of the place, as well as the condition of the sick person, the priest may also anoint additional parts of the body, for example, if appropriate, the area of pain or injury. If he does so, he does not repeat the formulas of anointing. What a beautiful sacrament: do we fully realize how great a gift this is?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

4 July ~ Saint Andrew of Crete. He was born in Damascus about the year 660. It is said that he was mute the first seven years of his life and began to speak only after he had received his First Holy Communion. At the age of 15, he entered the monastery of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. In 685, he was sent as a special emissary to the Imperial Court in Constantinople, where he was ordained deacon and, eventually, sent to be Archbishop of Gortyna on the island of Crete. He was renowned for his preaching and his hymns. Most famously, he wrote the Great Canon of Repentance, used during Lent, with moves through the books of the Old and New Testaments, citing examples of repentance, humility, and forgiveness. It takes a full three hours to chant in its entirety and includes about 200 prostrations! Many of Andrew's other hymns are also still used in the Greek Church, where he is invoked as patron saint of church musicians. Saint Andrew of Crete, pray for us!
