PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

At the risk of offending (and I know I will), I want to offer a number of gentle suggestions on proper behavior at Mass. One might ask right off, is there a different kind of behavior required at Mass than elsewhere? Answer: Yes, because when we are at Mass, we are in the House of God. We behave differently out of respect for God Himself, not just out of respect for ourselves or for others. That being true and pretty well accepted by most, let's start with behavior that is mandated by the Church herself, and therefore the most important. I am referring to the Eucharistic Fast. It is Church law that one must fast for at least one hour before receiving Holy Communion. (Water and medicine can be consumed any time, of course, though bringing a water bottle into church is almost never necessary. When we have a cold or sore throat, lozenges and cough drops may be necessary – this is not a problem – but only when we are truly sick.) The purpose of the hour fast is to help us prepare to receive Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. In reality, it is almost no fast at all, since on a Sunday, Holy Communion is given at around the 45 minute mark. We only need to fast about 15 minutes before Mass begins! Surely this is not too much to ask, when we consider whom it is we receive in that Sacrament. Keep the Eucharistic Fast! It's so little to ask!

SAINT OF THE WEEK

24 July ~ Saint Boris: Saint Vladimir of Kiev was the king who accepted baptism and made Russia a Christian nation, leaving behind the pagan gods and his many wives. When Vladimir died suddenly in 1015, his son Sviatopolk, still a pagan, seized the throne and set out to eliminate other contenders, especially his half-brothers, Boris and Gleb, who had become Christians. When word of this was spread among the people, an army rose up to defend Boris, but Boris refused to fight his brother, seeing in him the rightful ruler to whom he owed allegiance. He betook himself to prayer on the banks of the River Alta, begging for God's mercy. The next morning, Sviatopolk's henchman found him and brutally stabbed him to death. They did the same to the defenseless Gleb later that year. Another brother, Jaroslav, later defeated Sviatopolk, recovered the bodies of Boris and Gleb, and had them buried in the church of Saint Basil in Vyshgorod. Many miracles of healing were reported at the shrine, and the people called the holy brothers "passion-bearers," since in imitation of Christ, they had refused to fight, going "like lambs to the slaughter." They were canonized in the Latin Church by Pope Benedict XIII in 1724. Boris is the patron saint of Moscow. Saint Boris, pray for us!




Respect Life Ministry
