PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

Forty years ago, this was something that everyone knew, but nowadays it cannot be taken for granted: Neither food nor drink is brought into church. Some parishes (like our cathedral parish, Saint Mary's) have had to put up signs at the door to stop this problem! The exceptions would be a drink for very small children, water for the priest or choir (if used discreetly) and water for those who are ill. Hydration is a good thing, but can we trust that God will not allow us who are healthy to die of thirst during the hour we are at Mass? Bringing any kind of snack into church is not appropriate, because we want to set the church apart as a place of prayer and reflection. The only nourishment allowed is the spiritual kind. No snacking in the House of God! To be honest, this is not a major problem at regular weekend or weekday Masses, but at funerals, weddings and baptisms, I have had to ask people to take their Dunkin' Donuts purchases outside. It was embarrassing for all concerned, me especially. To know that one never brought food or drink into church was taken for granted 40 years ago, but alas, no more.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

31 July ~ Saint Ignatius Loyola. Born in the Basque region of Spain in 1491, he lived a worldly, dissipated life as a soldier until he suffered a grave wound in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521 and, while recovering, underwent a profound conversion to the Lord. He made his theological studies in Paris and, such was his magnetic personality, immediately began to gather followers around him. They headed for Rome, where Ignatius was ordained and established the little group as the Society of Jesus (called Jesuits). In this he was opposed by Pope Paul IV, who had himself formed a religious order (the Theatines) whose charism was very like that of the Jesuits and seemed to be in competition with them. This made for tension with the powers in Rome, but Ignatius never doubted himself or his Order, nor did he ever disobey the Pope. The Jesuits went on to do great works in the Church of the Counter Reformation and down to our day. Their motto is *Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam*: To the Greater Glory of God. Ignatius died in 1556 and was canonized in 1622. He is the patron saint of spiritual directors. Saint Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!
