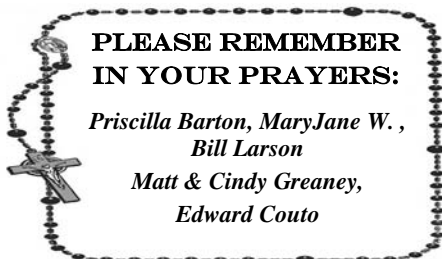

PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

Please be quiet while in church. Once you enter the sanctuary of God, which is the church, it is not the time or place to visit with those around you. I can well remember, as a boy, when talking in church was considered a venial sin that we confessed! No more. Perhaps that was extreme, but have we gone to the other extreme now? People carry on extended conversations at a normal tone of voice that absolutely interferes with the silence and prayer of those around us. If we see someone we know, we greet him or her with a few words and a smile. If we must talk, we do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Remember that our conversation might be disturbing someone who is in prayer, which is much more important than what we have to say to each other. People come to church to pray, to enjoy these moments of silence and solitude that are not possible outside the church doors, in the noisy world. In the monastery, we were always told, "Silence is a gift that we give to each other." If I do not give the gift of silence to those around me, they have no way to produce their own! Let us recommit ourselves to this great, lost principle: silence in church. Sssshhhhhhh.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

20 September ~ Saint Cecilia Yu So-sa. Cecilia was born in 1761 in Korea and raised a Catholic. She married Augustine Chong and they had six children, at which point Christianity was outlawed in Korea. Her husband was arrested and put to death in 1801; Cecilia's life was spared, but all her belongings were confiscated by the state. She had nothing. Some time later, Cecilia had a consoling dream. Her martyred husband appeared and told her he had built a house for her in heaven, with eight rooms. Cecilia understood that the rooms were for their family. Her son Paul was secretly helping to bring priests into Korea. When he was named to assist the bishop, Cecilia went to live with him. Hers was a beautiful life of prayer and sacrifice. When someone was in need of food, she would fast and use the money saved to feed them. At one point, she was offered a safer place to live, but she refused, wishing to stay close to her son and his work. In 1839, at the age of 78, Cecilia was arrested and commanded to renounce her faith. In five separate interrogations, the police demanded that she tell them the whereabouts of her son. When she refused, she was whipped 239 times. She died lying on the ground in prison, calling upon the names of Jesus and Mary. She is one of the 103 canonized martyrs of Korea. Saint Cecilia, pray for us!
