PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

It is a wonderful thing to see young families at Mass with little babies and toddlers. Every priest and pastor loves this, because in these infants we see children of God and the future church. However, we all know that babies will, at times, make their presence known by crying. This is not a problem, but parents should realize when that invisible but clear line of noise is crossed and it is better to "retreat" for the sake of the other parishioners. At that point (very loud crying or tantrums) we must take our child to the back of the church. Every parent knows that sometimes the baby is going to have a bad day. We just don't want to make everyone else's day bad, as well. There is no reason to be embarrassed about having to quiet your child in the back of the church. It is worse to allow them to disrupt the prayer of our neighbors continually. Again, this is always a judgment call, but most of us know when the moment has come. Parents, thank you for bringing your children to Mass! And thank you also for thinking of the rest of us!

SAINT OF THE WEEK

1 October ~ Saint Bavo: Born about 622, he was a nobleman in Brabant, in present-day Belgium. He had a wife and a daughter and a reputation for sinfulness and vice. In particular, he used to raise extra funds by selling his household servants into slavery. One day, not long after he had become a widower, he heard a sermon preached by Saint Amandus. His words so touched Bavo that he was moved to tears over his many sins. By the end of the sermon, he had thrown himself at Amandus' feet, begging for God's mercy. Amandus counseled Bavo to give away his many possessions to the poor. Bavo immediately went and did so. He then became a disciple of Amandus, following him to Flanders and France and helping in his missionary work. On one of these journeys, Bavo met one of the servants he had sold into slavery and begged the man to drag him to the local jail in chains as punishment. Some time later Bavo, still penitent, decided to live as a hermit in the hollow trunk of a tree. After a while, he moved to the monastery at Ghent and lived there until his death. He was seen as such a holy man that after he died, the monastery was named after him. He died in 659. Saint Bavo, pray for us!
