PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

There should be never be any bulletin reading during Holy Mass! Imagine if you invited a guest to your house, and before dinner (or during) they decided to read a magazine or book instead of conversing with you, their host. That is what is happening in God's House when we read the bulletin or anything else but the missal or the day's readings during the celebration of Mass. This doesn't mean we can't come early to church, take the bulletin or The Anchor as we enter and, after we kneel and pray for a while, have a nice read. But once Mass begins, every eye and mind and heart should be with the sacred action of the liturgy. We gain so much more from the eternal truths of the Mass than we could ever get from the parish bulletin or the diocesan newspaper.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

16 October ~ Saint Hedwig of Silesia. She was born in Bavaria around 1174 and was married while still a girl to King Henry of Silesia. Henry administered his kingdom with wisdom and prudence; at his side, Hedwig founded monasteries, hospitals and almshouses. She and Henry endowed the Cistercian convent in Trebnitz, where their daughter Gertrude was among the first abbesses. They had seven children in all. After the seventh, Hedwig and Henry decided to make a vow of celibacy. He took the tonsure of the monks; she frequented the abbey in Trebnitz. Her two quarrelsome sons and her husband's constant wars were Hedwig's greatest concern, yet she took every sorrow to prayer and came away strengthened. Henry died in 1238, and everyone supposed Hedwig would make monastic vows and enter the convent, but she never did. She remained in the lay state so that she could spend her fortune in the care of the poor. Her greatest joy was in teaching the catechism. The story is told that she took a poor, illiterate woman into her home, where she spent 10 weeks teaching her, word by word, the Our Father, which she was finally able to recite, to Hedwig's delight. She died in Trebnitz in 1243. Saint Hedwig, pray for us!
