PROPER BEHAVIOR AT MASS

When attending Mass, we should respect the personal boundaries others may have in all things. You may be in the habit, when at Mass with your family, of holding hands to pray the Our Father. Not everyone wishes to do that, for any number of reasons, which will remain private and unknown to you. This must be respected. Likewise, at the Sign of Peace, the person next to you may be sick and not wish to shake your hand out of concern for your health. One never knows! We ought never to make personal judgments because our neighbor at Mass may seem to be worshipping differently, within reason of course. We are present at Mass to offer our personal sacrifice of praise to God; everything else is secondary.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

23 October ~ Saint Allucio. He was the son of country land-owners in Tuscany and spent his youth herding sheep and cattle. He had a deep love for the poor, and eventually the residents of his hometown convinced him to run the local almshouse. Seeing the great needs of the pilgrim travelers who passed through Pescia on their way to Rome, he began to build hospices where the weary could rest and the sick could receive medical care. When Allucio heard that a wealthy Lord was charging exorbitant fees to ferry pilgrims across the River Arno, he had a bridge built that all could use for free. His efforts attracted much attention, and in time an order of brothers grew up around him devoted to helping pilgrims at bridges and mountain passes. They were later to be known as the Brothers of Saint Allucio. He is also remembered for his role in making peace between the city-states of Ravenna and Faenza. Through his persistent efforts at mediation, the warring factions laid down their weapons. Allucio died in 1134. His relics are venerated to this day in the basilica in Pescia. Saint Allucio, pray for us!
