From Father Johnson

THE SIX COMMANDMENTS

We all know about the Ten Commandments, given by God on Mount Sinai to Moses. Who remembers the Commandments of the Church, which we learned as children? There are six of them, not ten, and they are not given directly by God; they are ecclesiastical law. They are binding on all Catholics as universal precepts but not as divine precepts. There are six commandments of the church, which we will consider over the next six weeks:

1. To assist at Mass on all Sundays and holy days of obligation.
2. To fast and to abstain on the days appointed.
3. To confess our sins at least once a year.
4. To receive Holy Communion during Eastertide.
5. To contribute to the support of the Church.
6. To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

16 November ~ Saint Margaret of Scotland. She was born in 1045, her mother a Hungarian noblewoman and her father of the line of Anglo-Saxon kings. She spent part of her childhood at the Hungarian court in the company of devout teachers. In her teens she returned to England with her mother, but the Norman Conquest was in full swing, and they sought refuge in Scotland at the court of King Malcolm III. The king was smitten with the beautiful Margaret and took her to wife. Her biographer describes her as a woman with a great sense of beauty and proportion: she transformed every aspect of her environment, from the vestments of the priests to the wall hangings and furniture of the palace. She was an absolutely devoted wife, mother and queen. Toward Malcolm she bore a tender love. She herself instructed her children in the faith, teaching them "about Christ and the things of Christ", as far as their age would permit, and she told them to love him always. Three of her sons ascended the throne, and her son David is honored as a saint. Margaret urged her subjects to accept the Roman Rite of the Mass, founded many monasteries, gave alms generously, and started a ferry service for pilgrims going to visit Saint Andrews. She died in 1092. Saint Margaret of Scotland, pray for us!
