## From Father Johnson

### THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

The second corporal work of mercy, right out of the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of St. Matthew chapter 25, is to give drink to the thirsty: Jesus said, "I was thirsty and you gave me to drink." These words make us think immediately of his Passion; in his last moments of agony on the Cross, Jesus cried out, "I thirst!" These verses make us realize the meaning of all the corporal works of mercy: it is Jesus himself whom we see and minister to in the hungry and the thirsty, and to all in need. Jesus tells us, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." Father Donald Haggerty has written of the sacredness of this act of mercy, giving drink to the thirsty: "On numerous occasions I have witnessed one of Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity caring for the dying, fully concentrated in the act of gently giving some water by spoon to a dying person. They seemed to be wholly absorbed in their action, as though praying. The sacredness of those acts can be compared in a way to the lifting of the Chalice of the Precious Blood of Jesus at Mass."

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

**27 January ~ Saint Angela Merici.** She was born and raised in Desenzano on Lake Garda in northern Italy in a family of strong devotion, but by her early twenties, her parents, brothers and sisters had all died. She lived alone in her family home and joined the Third Order of Saint Francis, becoming a witness to poverty and prayer, and a light and model to all the girls of the neighborhood. One day, Angela had a vision: young women dressed in white were going up and down a ladder to heaven. One of them told her to go to the nearby Brescia and start a "Company of Virgins." She did so. In Brescia, long-term wars had destroyed families, so that young, uneducated girls were falling into poverty and prostitution. Angela had found her mission. Over many years, she gathered her "Company," young women of courage and steadfast loyalty. They wore white veils as a sign of their consecration, but lived in their own homes. Their work was to teach girls, especially those most at risk. Angela told them, I beg of you meekly that you try to win all with affection and a gentle hand and with sweetness, not with harsh commands." As the Order grew, so did Angela's fame. When she went to Rome in 1525, the Pope offered to make her the head of an order of nursing sisters, but Angela wanted to stay with her girls. Shortly after her death in 1540, her Company became the Ursuline Sisters. They continue to serve to this day. Saint Angela Merici, pray for us!
