THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

The third corporal work of mercy is to clothe the naked. "I was naked and you clothed me," says Jesus in Matthew 25:36. As with our giving drink to the thirsty, we find here a strong link between this work of mercy and the Passion of Jesus, who was stripped of his garments by the soldiers before being nailed to the Cross. The indignity Jesus suffered in this public humiliation made those who loved him avert their eyes. Perhaps some wanted to offer him their cloak, but could not! We should see the naked, crucified Jesus in the poor who have insufficient clothing, especially in the cold winter months. How many of us could help them by cleaning out our closets of old, unused clothing and donating it to Catholic Charities or Saint Vincent de Paul or to a storefront like Marie's Place, always with a prayer for those who will receive our charity. We, ourselves, may need other people's help some day, so we should do for others as we would want done for ourselves.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

3 February ~ Saint Claudine Thevenet. Claudine was born in 1774 in Lyons, France, second child of a family of seven. In 1794, at the height of the Reign of Terror in the French Revolution, she watched two of her brothers as they were hauled off to be shot. Her brother Louis-Antoine's last words stayed with her: "Look, Claudine, forgive as we forgive." Claudine threw herself into parish work and commended her troubles to God in prayer. When someone brought her two shivering orphans who had been found under the steps of a nearby church, she and a friend started the "Providence of the Sacred Heart." She created a shelter for even more orphans, teaching the children to work with their hands. Soon she opened a school for upper-class girls as well. She told her sisters, "Be mothers to these children, yes, true mothers of both body and soul." In her later years, Claudine bore financial troubles, the premature deaths of two of her most beloved sisters, and the pressure to merge her order, all with abiding confidence. On her deathbed, she suffered a stern rebuke from the priest who was chaplain to her sisters. Sinking into paralysis, she offered him her final forgiveness. "How good God is," were her dying words. Saint Claudine, pray for us!


