THE SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY

The fourth spiritual work of mercy is to comfort the afflicted or the sorrowful. This is an easy one! Human nature seems to contain an inborn capacity to reach out to comfort those who are suffering. What makes it specifically Christian is our understanding of Jesus, the Man of Sorrows, who though he was so afflicted in his Passion and Death, was filled with an infinite empathy for us sinners. In his agony, he still prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." How do we best comfort the sorrowing, aside from the assurance of our presence and aid? By reminding them that there is an eternal life waiting for all who do God's will and keep his commands, where all sorrow, all affliction will be blotted out by unending joy.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

8 April ~ Saint Julie Billiart. Julie was born in 1751, the child of well-off parents in Cuvilly, in the north of France. As a teen she was already very involved in the parish, teaching the younger children their catechism. When she was 22, she was sitting at home with her father when an unknown person shot at him through an open window. He was unhurt, but Julie suffered a severe nervous shock. By the age of 30, she was bedridden. Still, the neighborhood children flocked to her bedside to learn about Jesus. In 1789, at the height of the French Revolution, Julie was carried from her bed into hiding for three years. Afterwards, after meeting another saintly lady named Frances de Bourdon, the two founded the Sisters of Notre Dame, for the education of children, especially the poor. That same year, Julie experienced a miraculous recovery while praying a novena to the Sacred Heart. Her legs, now healed, would carry her on over 100 journeys to establish the Order. Julie centered the spiritual life of her sisters on their preparation for the classroom, so that they "might live alone with God, even in the midst of a large class of children." Since her death in 1816, her Order has spread to five continents. Saint Julie Billiart, pray for us!
