SAINT OF THE WEEK

19 May ~ Saint Joaquina de Mas. She was born to a distinguished family in Barcelona in 1783. At the age of twelve she went to the local Carmelite convent and demanded to be let in. Her parents, however, had arranged a marriage with a wealthy lawyer, Theodore de Mas. Joaquina confided to him that she felt she had a religious vocation, but he told her that, after their children were grown, she would be free to enter the convent. Joaquina agreed. Together they had eight children, at which point Theodore died suddenly. Joaquina was only thirty-three. She devoted herself to the education of her children and embraced voluntary poverty, wearing the Franciscan habit and caring for the sick in her free time. Ten years passed, and Joaquina saw her children married and comfortably situated. At the urging of her spiritual director, she now fulfilled her dream of becoming a Carmelite. She started a new Order, the Carmelites of Charity, whose charism was teaching children and caring for the sick. In 1850, the Order was approved by Rome. That same year, Joaquina began to suffer a gradual paralysis. Over the next four years, she was forced to step down as Superior and take her place among the other sisters. This she accepted wholeheartedly, accepting it all as coming from God's hand. She died in 1854. Saint Joaquina, pray for us!
