THE HOLY OILS

The third and final Holy Oil is called Sacred Chrism. "Chrism" is obviously very close to the word "Christ," a name that literally means someone anointed with Chrism. "Jesus Christ" means Anointed Savior or Savior Anointed with Chrism. This Holy Oil is used in Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders, and in ancient days it was used to anoint kings and queens at their crowning. It is the only oil that has a scent added (usually balsam), so it is immediately recognizable by its beautiful smell. It is also unique in that when the bishop blesses this oil at the Chrism Mass, all the priests there present join in the blessing, stretching out their hands in silence towards the oil as the bishop says or sings the prayer. The blessing of Sacred Chrism, in contrast to the other two Oils, is called a consecration, the same word used of the Holy Eucharist. The bishop begins this consecration with a call to prayer: "Let us pray that God our Almighty Father will bless this oil, so that all who are anointed with it may be inwardly transformed and come to share in eternal salvation." We then all pray in silence as the bishop breathes upon the oil, an act that symbolizes the action of the Holy Spirit who is to come upon the oil and enter it. He then begins the long and beautiful prayer of consecration.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

22 June ~ Saint John Fisher. John was born the son of a draper in Beverley, Yorkshire, England, in 1469. A brilliant boy, he went to Cambridge at fourteen and eventually became vice-chancellor of the university. He was a man of deep prayer. Ordained a priest, Fisher was soon named Bishop of Rochester at the age of 35 by King Henry VII. He became a close friend of the royal family; in 1509, he preached at the king's funeral. Some 20 years later, when Henry VIII petitioned the pope to annul his marriage to Catherine of Aragon, John preached strongly on the indissolubility of marriage and let it be known he was ready to die to defend this truth. Not surprisingly, when the papal decision against Henry was handed down, John Fisher was one of the first victims of his wrath. He was imprisoned in the Tower of London on 13 April 1534 and lingered there for fourteen months. When the pope made John a cardinal, thinking the King might not put a cardinal to death, the King forbade the red hat from entering the country, saying he would send Fisher's head to Rome instead. Indeed, he was beheaded on 22 June 1535. His head was then displayed on London Bridge and was taken down only to make room for the head of Saint Thomas More. Saint John Fisher, pray for us!
