## From Father Johnson

### THE HOLY OILS

The bishop continues the consecration of the Chrism, as all the priests present join silently in his prayer, right arms outstretched towards the oil. He asks God to “make this Chrism a sign of life and salvation for those who are to be born again in the waters of Baptism. Wash away the evil they have inherited from sinful Adam, and when they are anointed with this holy oil make them temples of your glory, radiant with the goodness of life that has its source in you.” The Oil will be an effective sign of God’s life in us, will wash away the evil of original sin and make us not just free from sin, but actual temples of God’s own glory. Where sin abounded, the grace of God will even more abound: “Through this sign of Chrism grant them royal, priestly and prophetic honor, and clothe them with incorruption. Let this be indeed the Chrism of salvation for those who will be born again of water and the Holy Spirit. May they come to share eternal life in the glory of your kingdom.” That is the final goal, the end of every sacrament : heaven.

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

**11 July ~ Saint Olga of Kiev.** Born around 880, Olga was a daughter of the Vikings, the pagan invaders of Russia, and she married Prince Igor of Kiev, a Slav, ruler of Russia. In 945, Igor was assassinated. Since their son Svyatoslav was still an infant, Olga ruled as regent. Legend tells of the brutal ways Olga, still a heathen, dealt with her husband’s murderers, burning them and burying them alive. She resolutely refused to remarry, keeping the throne for her son and carefully administering the kingdom. In 957, Olga was baptized in Constantinople, at least partly as a political move, because that created stronger ties with the Emperor there. But the faith truly took root in Olga. She attempted to evangelize her son and her people, but with little success. Olga’s great success, though, was the seed of faith she planted in her grandson, Vladimir. She taught him from a young age and, as an adult, he embraced Christianity, making it the state religion. Olga is revered among the Russians as “equal to the Apostles” for her efforts in bringing the faith to her country. She died in 969. Saint Olga, pray for us!

### KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MUSEUM

Fleeing Famine: Irish Immigration to North America. From 1845 to 1860, more than 1.5 million Irish immigrants sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to the United States and Canada. In the cramped quarters below the decks of the "coffin ships," the journey was fraught with the hardship of inclement weather and the peril of disease, but in spite of their uncertain future, the travelers faced these adversities in hopes of finding a better way of life in North America. At the center of the Fleeing Famine exhibition are six paintings by British artist Rodney Charman that depict the arduous journey of these Irish men, women, and children. All ships represented in the artwork were real, and many focus on a specific voyage. Also included are several bronze sculptures on loan courtesy of Ireland's Great Hunger Museum at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, Connecticut.
