THE HOLY OILS

The oil called Sacred Chrism is used in three Sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. In Baptism, just after the priest or deacon has actually poured the water, he immediately anoints the infant with Sacred Chrism. This is really a looking forward sacramentally to the time when the child will be confirmed. The following prayer is said: "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people. He now anoints you with the Chrism of Salvation. As Christ was anointed Prophet, Priest, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life." As the prayer shows us, our vocation as Christians (the People of Christ, the People of Chrism) is to share in the prophetic, priestly and kingly character of Jesus himself. We have been baptized into the Paschal Mystery, which is the death and rising of Christ. The anointing with Sacred Chrism seals that mystery in the very depths of our being.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

18 July ~ Saint Camillus de Lellis. Born in 1550, Camillus lost his mother in infancy and was raised by his soldier father, whom he followed into the army. A towering bear of a man with enormous strength, Camillus soon earned a reputation as a fighter and a risk-taker. By the age of 24 he had lost everything to gambling. He had also developed painful ulcers on his legs, which forced him to leave the army. Camillus then found work as a carpenter at a Capuchin friary, where the brother porter treated him kindly and led him to repent of his many sins. He went so far as to ask to be admitted as a lay brother, but his bad legs made it impossible. Still wishing to serve God, Camillus went to the Hospital of Saint James in Rome where he had been a patient and began to nurse the sick. Appalled by the filth and laziness and disorder he saw among the hospital staff, he resolved to found a community of men that would make the spiritual and physical well-being of patients the heart of their vocation; he called them the Ministers of the Sick (Camillans). Camillus saw in each sick patient the image of the crucified Lord. Many miraculous healings were attributed to him, both in life and in death. He died in 1615 and is the patron saint of nurses. Saint Camillus de Lellis, pray for us!

Fleeing Famine: Irish Immigration to North America. From 1845 to 1860, more than 1.5 million Irish immigrants sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to the United States and Canada. In the cramped quarters below the decks of the “coffin ships,” the journey was fraught with the hardship of inclement weather and the peril of disease, but in spite of their uncertain future, the travelers faced these adversities in hopes of finding a better way of life in North America. At the center of the Fleeing Famine exhibition are six paintings by British artist Rodney Charman that depict the arduous journey of these Irish men, women, and children. All ships represented in the artwork were real, and many focus on a specific voyage. Also included are several bronze sculptures on loan courtesy of Ireland’s Great Hunger Museum at Quinnipiac University in Hamden, Connecticut.
