

From Father Johnson

THE HOLY OILS

Confirmation is the second sacrament that makes use of Sacred Chrism. The bishop makes the sign of the cross with the Chrism on the forehead of the one being confirmed and says, using the person's Confirmation name, "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is a seal of grace that preserves and strengthens (confirms) the graces of Baptism; Sacred Chrism is the matter that the Church (by the action of the Holy Spirit) uses to effect this. Just as something as simple and common as bread and wine are the matter that bring us, once they are consecrated, the Body and Blood of Christ, so the olive oil of Sacred Chrism is the efficacious sign that we are receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit. This is the glorious faith of the Catholic Church.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

27 July ~ Saints Aurelius, Natalia & Companions. Aurelius was born about 820, the Christian son of a Muslim and a Christian Spaniard. He married a Muslim girl called Sabigotho, who changed her name to Natalia when she accepted baptism. The couple practiced the Catholic faith in secret, because Islam was the only acceptable religion to the Muslim rulers of Cordoba. But one day Aurelius saw a slave being beaten for having publicly denounced Islam. He began to worry whether he and Natalia should be living their faith openly, though, at the same time, he worried about what would happen to their little children. A wise priest named Eulogius advised them to provide for their children first and then to live their faith with courage. Aurelius and Natalia brought their little ones to a good Christian widow named Isabella. They then began regularly to visit the Christians who were being held in the city prisons. Soon, Aurelia and Natalia were joined in their ministry by another couple, Felix and Liliosa. Natalia and Liliosa soon made bold to go to Mass with their faces unveiled, a clear sign that they were no longer Muslims. Shortly afterward, all four were arrested and tried with being infidels. A monk named George was imprisoned with them and shared their sentence: death for apostasy from Islam. Martyrs of Cordoba, pray for us!
