THE HOLY OILS

The third Sacrament in which Sacred Chrism is used is Holy Orders. Whenever a priest or bishop is ordained, the Chrism is applied immediately after the prayer and the laying on of hands. In the case of a priest, the Chrism is applied to the palms of his hands; in that of a bishop, to the crown of his head. The bishop who is to be ordained kneels before the ordaining bishop, who says this prayer: "May God, who has made you a sharer of the High Priesthood of Christ, himself pour out upon you the oil of mystical anointing and make you fruitful with an abundance of spiritual blessings." This "oil of mystical anointing," which is God's grace and blessing on the new bishop, is made effective by the Sacred Chrism poured upon his head. A sacrament is a visible sign instituted by Christ to give grace, as our old catechisms told us. The Sacred Chrism is the visible and material sign of the oil of gladness, which makes a priest a bishop, successor of the Apostles. For priests, the ordaining Bishop anoints their palms with the Chrism and prays: "May the Lord Jesus Christ, whom the Father anointed with the Holy Spirit and power, guard and preserve you, that you may sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God." Priests are to hold the place of Christ in the Church and do what he did: sanctify the people and offer sacrifice to God.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

2 August ~ Saint Thomas of Dover. Born about the year 1220, Thomas Hale was an English monk who had lived all his life under the Rule of Saint Benedict in Saint Martin's Priory, Dover. When the French invaded Dover in 1295, they overwhelmed the gates of the priory and set the buildings alight. The other monks fled, but Thomas, aged and infirm, remained and retired to his room for a period of rest as the Rule prescribed. The French invaders found him there, as they searched the dormitory for the monastery's valuables: books, vestments, vessels of the altar, and reliquaries of silver and gold. They demanded that Thomas show them where the treasures were kept. Thomas, it is said, answered in all simplicity, that he did indeed have a treasure, laid up in the recesses of his heart: "my Lord Jesus and His Blessed Mother." The raiders responded with thrusts of sword and spear. They gathered what booty they could find and left Thomas's hacked body behind. When the other monks returned, they buried their fallen confrere. His grave immediately became a place of pilgrimage associated with miraculous healings. Saint Thomas of Dover, pray for us!
