From Father Johnson

HOLY MASS

The very first act of our preparation for this great moment of Eucharistic Sacrifice is the Entrance Hymn or Introit. If the Mass is simple, as on an ordinary weekday, the priest processes in alone or with a server, usually without any singing. For a Sunday Mass, there is a more solemn procession: incense (if used), cross bearer, altar servers, possibly a deacon, and then the priest. And of course, there is music, because this is to be a joyful though solemn celebration. The music is, if possible, a setting of the entrance antiphon, which is given in the missal for every Mass. The text of this antiphon is specially chosen and many have been in place for over a thousand years. If this antiphon cannot be sung, a hymn is chosen which will accord with the feast or the texts of the Mass. Whatever hymn is sung, it should be directed to God and his Saints and not at us. The assembly of the faithful is there to worship the Lord, not itself. (This is a pet peeve of mine about some modern church music!) The procession passes down the center aisle of the church, passing right through the midst of the people as a way of gathering their attention and lifting their hearts for what is to come. We are One Body in Christ. Even those who don't sing well should participate as best they can. God doesn't want or need all opera singers to praise him well. Next week: Greeting God.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Moses the Black He was a black 28 August Ethiopian who had escaped from slavery, born about 330 AD. A towering man with great strength, he became the leader of a gang that terrorized travelers and landowners around the River Nile. One night, one of Moses' heists was thwarted by a barking sheepdog, and he vowed vengeance. He swam across the river and made off with four sheep. After feasting on them, Moses sold their skins to buy wine and returned to his gang. But everything began to change for Moses when he was forced to hide in the Monastery of Petra, in the desert. He was fascinated by the simple life of the monks and decided to become a monk himself. Seeing his need for reform, Moses dedicated himself to penance, prayer, and hard work. Yet improving his life was not easy, and he grew discouraged. So one day, the abbot brought Moses to the roof of the monastery at sunrise. "Look," he said to Moses, "it takes some time for the light to drive away the darkness. So it is with the soul." When Moses was 75, robbing Berbers attacked the monastery. After helping his brothers to escape, Moses stayed to fight and was slain by the invaders. Many of his sayings are preserved in the sayings of the Desert Fathers. He died in 405. Saint Moses the Black, pray for us!
