HOLY MASS

After the Gloria has been sung, we are ready to pray even more intensely. The COLLECT (also called the Opening Prayer) does what its name implies: it collects the prayers of all those present at Mass. The Priest collects them into one, saying, "Let us pray," followed by a brief silence in which we make known our needs to God. He then offers our gathered petitions to the Father in on voice, using prayers that are among the most ancient and rich in the treasury of the Church. He opens his hands in imitation of the Cross of Christ, and, acting in the person of Jesus, begins to pray in the name of the whole Church, especially those present. The Collect has three parts: the opening lines praise God, the middle lines ask him for something, and the concluding doxology of praise sums up the prayer by glorifying the

Saint of the week

Saint Publia of Antioch

Publia was a widow who founded a community of consecrated women in ancient Antioch around 350. In 362, the Emperor Julian the Apostate came to Antioch to prepare his military campaign against the Persians. He was half-brother to Constantine the Great, who had legalized Christianity in the Roman empire, but Julian had then renounced his Christian faith, On becoming emperor, he had restored pagan worship and stripped Christians their privileges. Though Julian started no outright persecutions, he certainly tolerated violence against Christians who refused to honor the Roman gods, Publia knew all this, and when Julian marched by her convent, she led her sisters outside and intoned the 115th psalm: "Their idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands. They have moths but they cannot speak; they have eyes but they cannot see. Their makers will come to be like them." It was a very public statement of Christian belief. The emperor stopped and ordered the women to be silent. But they began singing again: "Let God arise; let his foes be scattered!" Julian had Publia beaten publically, and intended to put her and the other nuns on trial, but he died before this could be carried out. Saint Publia, pray for us!
