**HOLY MASS**

The high point of the Liturgy of the Word is, of course, the proclamation of the Gospel, taken from one of the four New Testament accounts of the life of Jesus, by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. While we hold all the scriptures in the highest esteem, the Gospels have always held first place in the mind of the Church because they contain the very words of the Lord Jesus. The Gospel is read publicly only by a deacon or priest, a sign of its special importance. It is preceded by the great shout of praise to God, the Alleluia. We are so used to this word Alleluia, we don't realize perhaps that it is a foreign language. It is Hebrew and means, "Praise to the Lord!" In the Bible, the word appears most frequently in the Book of Psalms, as we might expect. Before the Gospel is read, there is often a procession with candles and incense to the ambo, another sign of the importance of what we are about to hear. We had sat down to hear the first two Readings of the Mass, but we stand in reverence to hear the very words of Jesus in the Gospel. When the deacon or priest announces the Gospel reading, we say "Glory to you, Lord," and use our right thumb to make a Cross on our forehead, lips, and chest; this is a sign that we want the words of the Gospel to bless our thoughts, words, and emotions. All these outward signs of special solemnity are to help us realize what an awesome moment this is, when we are about to hear the very words that Jesus spoke and the very deeds he accomplished for our salvation. When the Gospel is ended, we thank Jesus by saying, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." *Next week: the Homily*

**Saint of the Week**

**5 November Saint Charles Borromeo**

Charles was born in his family's castle in Arona, Italy. From his youth, he had a speech impediment, probably a stammer. After his uncle was elected Pope Paul IV, the twenty-one-year-old Charles was made a Cardinal and Archbishop of Milan. He steered the final session of the Council of Trent and authored many of its reforms. In the midst of his many duties, Charles longed to enter a monastery, but a friend counseled him to stay in the world. Luckily for the Church, he took his advice. In 1566 Charles was at last able to go to his diocese, which had been eighty years without a resident bishop. Almost everything was in need of reform. Charles set the example for his priests by radically downsizing his household. For the education of children, he established the first Sunday schools. He called synods and preached throughout the diocese, despite his speech defect. A fiend remarked, "I have often wondered how it was that, without any natural eloquence or anything attractive in his manner, he was able to work such changes in the hearts of his listeners. He spoke but little, gravely, in a voice barely audible, but his words always had an effect." When the plague struck Milan in 1576, Charles was on the front lines, giving the sacraments to the dying and providing for the poor from his own resources. He lived another eight years, dying in 1584 at the age of forty-six, a humble disciple of Jesus Christ as well as a great churchman. Saint Charles Borromeo, pray for us!
