From Father Johnson

HOLY MASS

Pray, brothers and sisters!: The priest concludes the preparation of the gifts by two prayers. First, he asks the faithful to intercede that "my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father." Why does he ask this? Because the sacrifice of the priest is the one only he can offer, as an as an ordained priest. Our sacrifices (those of the people, including the deacon) are the ones we have presented with the gifts of bread and wine, and that are now joined to the perfect sacrifice of Calvary. So the people respond by standing and praying for the priest: "May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church." This is the one instance during the Mass when the priest stands silent as the people respond, praying as a Royal Priesthood that God will accept the Eucharistic Sacrifice at the hands of the priest, for their good and the good of the entire holy Church of God. The priest then offers the prayer over the Gifts, the second proper prayer of the Mass (the Collect being the first one). The offertory prayers often display the irony of the human state: everything we are offering to God here has first been given us by him. Here is an example from Christmastide: "Receive our oblation, O Lord, by which is brought about a glorious exchange, that by offering what you have given, we may merit to receive your very self." *Next Week: Dialogue and Preface!*

Saint of the Week

Saint Fabiola

The life of Saint Fabiola comes to us through the writings of Saint Jerome. A wealthy Christian of Rome, Fabiola married a man much younger than herself. It was a disastrous union. He was an adulterer and his actions so vile that, as Saint Jerome wrote, not even a common slave would have put up with them. Fabiola sought and obtained civil divorce and then a second husband, a move that put her outside the communion of the Church. Although Jerome presumes that her desire in the second marriage was to avoid unchastity, even so, he concluded that Fabiola had unwittingly exposed herself to a wound from the devil. After the death of her second husband, she became suddenly aware of her wound. She appeared in the Lateran Basilica clad in sackcloth and ashes as a penitent. She then sold her possessions and gave the money to the poor and to a monastery. For a time, Fabiola devoutly studied the Scriptures with Jerome and other holy women in Bethlehem. Returning to Rome, she founded a hospital, where she tended the sick with her own hands, doing all the hardest tasks herself. She died in 399, and Saint Jerome lavishly praised her virtues, writing, "In her we have seen a fulfillment of Saint Paul's words. 'We know that all things work to the good for those who love God.' " Saint Fabiola, pray for us!
